## Scripture Lesson: Romans 8:12-17

---

So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh— for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, 'Abba! Father!' it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

## Pentecost Info:

On Pentecost Sunday, we remember the day the Holy Spirit was poured out on the disciples. The story is found in Acts 2, and describes how something like a powerful wind and tongues of fire was poured out on people from all over the world who came to Jerusalem to celebrate the Jewish feast of Shavuot. At the first Pentecost over 3000 people were baptized after receiving the Holy Spirit. Pentecost culminates the celebration and work of the church begun on Easter Day. It marks a shift from understanding what Jesus has done for us to being the disciples of Jesus that God has called us to be, offering grace and sharing Jesus with all the world.
